Apply for the School Opal Card

Cycling to School

Students residing within 3.6 km from School should consider cycling as their primary mode of transport.

Tips for a safe ride:

- Children under 16 can ride on the foothpath.
- Make sure your safety gear is working properly (helmet, brakes and bell).
- Be aware of hazards on the road, such as wet leaves, big puddles and gravel or rocks.
- Pay attention to others on the road and footpaths.
- Students should ask their parents for permission to ride to and from School.

- U-turns.
- Double parking.
