SCHOOL NURSE – CRANBROOK SENIOR SCHOOL CASUAL

Cranbrook School is seeking Registered Nurses to join our Senior School Health Centre team to commence as soon as possible.

ABOUT THE POSITION

This is a casual position with a combination of weekday and weekend shifts available. This is a term time only role, the Senior School Nurse is not required to work in student vacation periods.

Reporting to the Head of Health Centre, Senior School Nurses provide quality health care to both day students and boarders, as well as first aid for emergency care or injury of staff and visitors. The role includes the provision of medical support at inter-school sporting events, monitoring of boys at risk (such as returning to sport) and with special health requirements, medication administration, coordination of student immunisation programs, and maintenance of health records.

ABOUT YOU

The successful applicant will have either nursing experience in a school setting, or in general practice or community nursing. You will have a genuine interest in health promotion and student welfare, experience working with adolescents, and have a kind and empathetic nature.

You will have an appetite for a busy but key supportive role in a dynamic educational setting. You will be excited to be a part of further developing the role of the Health Centre, to take part in opportunities for health promotion and wellbeing initiatives with both students and staff, and to maintain and further enhance strong relationships with the Cranbrook boarding community.

- Registered Nurse with current registration certified by AHPRA
- Experience working in schools or if no school experience, recent experience in general practice or community nursing
- Comfortable using a range of IT applications
- Ability to work independently as well as part of a small team
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Ability to build relationships with a range of people within the School community, including students, parents and staff
- A proactive approach, demonstrated initiative and strong attention to detail
- A friendly, kind and courteous manner
- Honesty, patience and a sense of humour
- Ability to think clearly and remain calm under pressure
- A level of mobility that supports the ability to respond to a first aid / behavioural incident
