- A minimum of four years' counselling experience in a secondary school context
- Experience working with IB Programmes is highly desirable
- Highly organised, detail-focused, resourceful and inclusive
- Able to communicate and collaborate with people at all levels, with diverse backgrounds and a wide range of age groups
- Demonstrated expertise in using evidence-based practices to effectively inform counselling practice
- Able to take ownership of tasks, demonstrate initiative and produce work of a consistently high standard
- A level of mobility that supports the ability to respond to a first aid / behavioural incident
