



Uniform Guidelines & Presentation Standards

Cranbrook School's uniform is an important part of our identity and reflects the pride we take in our Community. Families are asked to ensure that students understand and follow these expectations at all times, both at School and when representing Cranbrook in the wider community.

PRE-SCHOOL – YEAR 2 PLAY-BASED UNIFORM GUIDELINES

Our play-based uniform is for daily wear for students at Pre-school or in Kindergarten - Year 2. The uniform must be worn appropriately. This includes going to and from school and attending after-school activities.

- Items within the play-based uniform are designed to be mixed and matched
- All accessories must be official Cranbrook uniform eg: puffer jacket; hats and socks
- Students may not wear sports or the play-based uniform mixed with their academic uniform
- The socks are white with a navy and red stripe
- The shoes are to be plain leather upper with a light coloured soft sole. No bright colours.
- In case of rain, a rain jackets must be navy blue (Year 3 - Year 12) or yellow (Pre-School - Year 2)
- The navy woollen cap can be worn to and from school (Kindergarten - Year 2)
- Sun Hat must be worn before school, fruit break and lunchtime

KINDERGARTEN – YEAR 2 BEST DRESSED UNIFORM GUIDELINES

The uniform must be worn appropriately. This includes going to and from school and attending after-school activities.

- The trousers and shorts are charcoal grey
- The shirt is light blue
- The tie is a Cranbrook tie
- All accessories must be official Cranbrook uniform eg: pullover, vest and cardigan
- Students may not wear sports or the play-based uniform mixed with their academic uniform
- The socks are navy with a white and red stripe
- The shoes are plain black leather dress shoes with sensibly shaped toe caps. All stitching must be black

- In case of rain, a rain jackets must be navy blue (Year 3 - Year 12) or yellow (Pre-School - Year 2)
- An art smock is required for art classes

Hair:

Every student's dress is important and reflects the standards of the School. This extends to haircuts. Generally, a student's hair should be unostentatious. Specifically, a student's hair must:

- Be a natural colour
- Not impede their sight or be over their eyes
- Not be below the collar unless it is tied back
- Not be less than a '4' in length. The width of one finger is a good indicator.
- Not be an obviously nonsymmetrical or irregular style
- Not be a conspicuously modern style including mullets, shaved lines, or undercuts

Make up & Accessories:

No make up is to be worn in school uniform and students may be asked to remove it by any staff member.

- A wristwatch can be worn
- No other jewellery is to be worn. There is an exception for religious reasons approved by the Deputy Heads (Kindergarten - Year 6) and worn under the uniform

YEAR 3 – YEAR 12 UNIFORM GUIDELINES

The uniform must be worn appropriately. This includes going to and from school and attending after-school activities.

- The trousers, shorts, and skirt are charcoal grey
- The skirt must be worn at the top of the knee. If the skirt is deemed too short, students have 24 hours to have it lengthened at their own cost
- The Cranbrook blazer must be worn to all formal school events including assemblies and chapel. The blazer is to be worn to and from School throughout Terms 2 and 3.

- The shirt is light blue for Years Kindergarten - Year 10, and white for Years 11 and 12, as well as for those from Year 7 - Year 12 involved in formal music performances
- The tie is a Cranbrook tie
- All accessories must be official Cranbrook uniform eg: pullover, vest and cardigan
- Students may not wear sports uniform (or hoodies for Year 7 upwards) mixed with their academic uniform
- The socks are navy with a white and red stripe
- Stockings can only be worn with the school skirt, not with the tunic or shorts
- The shoes are plain black leather dress shoes with sensibly shaped toe caps. All stitching must be black. The heel cannot be higher than 4cm
- When students need to get changed into their sports uniforms, they must use a nearby toilet or changing room. Students should not be changing in their locker or piazza areas

Hair:

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- Be a natural colour
- Not impede their sight or be over their eyes
- Not be below the collar unless it is tied back
- Not be less than a '4' in length. The width of one finger is a good indicator
- Not be an obviously nonsymmetrical or irregular style
- Not be a conspicuously modern style including mullets, shaved lines, or undercuts
- Only include hair accessories as follows: elastics, scrunchies, ribbons or clips must be red for Year 7 and white for Year 11

Make up & Accessories:

- Students' faces are to be clean shaven
- No make up is to be worn in school uniform and students may be asked to remove it by any staff member
- Nails are to be natural without nail polish. If nails are painted students will be asked to remove with acetone by their House mentor or Class Teacher. If nails are acrylic students will have 24 hours to have nail polish removed at their own cost
- Students may only wear one set of clear (plastic) studs in their ear lobes. All other piercings will be asked to be removed on the spot
- No tattoos are to be visible while wearing the school or sports uniform
- A wristwatch can be worn
- No other jewellery is to be worn. There is an exception for religious reasons approved by the House Mentor (Year 7 - Year 12) or Deputy Heads (Kindergarten - Year 6) and worn under the uniform.
